

DANGER SIGNS IN PREGNANCY

Please notify our office immediately if you have any of the following signs:

- * Vaginal bleeding of any kind
- * Fever
- * Severe Vomiting
- * Steady abdominal pain, unrelieved by a bowel movement
- * Severe, persistent headache
- * Dizziness, or fainting
- * Visual disturbances, such as seeing double
- * Sudden rapid weight gain (greater than 2 pounds a week)
- * Sudden swelling of hands and/or face
- * Very frequent urination and/or burning urination
- * Sudden gush of fluid from the vagina
- * No fetal movement (see handout on Fetal Kick Counts)

OTHER REASONS TO CONTACT OUR OFFICE:

- * Concerns about whether labor has started
- * Premature contractions
- * Prior to taking any new, non-prescribed medication, or medication obtained from anyone other than us (or contact the Pregnancy Risk Line, 801-328-BABY: see enclosed handout and tell us at your next appointment).

*****If you are unable to reach one of us and you have any of the above signs, or feel you have a potentially dangerous problem, go to the Labor and Delivery department of your hospital for immediate evaluation*****
